It is my will that my Executor purchase the three articles named as before - and present them, which I hope they will accept - as a token of the love & esteem I have for them. I request my Brother Life Sargent to be the Executor of this my last will & Testament and I do hereby nominate and appoint him for that purpose. In witness whereof I the said Abraham Allen have to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal, this day and year before written.

Mary Moffatt of Randolph County, State of North Carolina being sick in body but perfect in senses & memory do make this my last will & Testament. I leave unto my daughter Naomi Mackie one Quarter Acre of pasture land, & two barns & my table & my best Clock & a covered blue & white small spot & three shute & one blanket and one Check Sheet & Fifty Dollars & also the prof. I leave to my daughter Catherine Cox one pasture Acre last place & two barns, & my Dressers & cupboard & one pasture quart, one Floured covered blue & white. Three shute shute, one Check Sheet & one blanket & Fifty Dollars - I leave to my daughter Hannah Cox one pasture Acre & two barns & one black, fifteen of white cloth & a blue best quilt & two shute & one blanket, one Check Sheet & my halant Chest & my best Clock and Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my son Robert Moffatt one covered blue horse & two shute & one shute black & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my son William Moffatt one covered blue & white skin the horse & two shute & one shute black & a wolf trough & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my Daughter Mary Walker one pasture Acre six plates & two horses one covered & four shute one blanket, one Check Sheet & my copper kettle one five or six Gallon pot & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my Daughter Margaret Moffatt one Quarter Acre of pasture land two barns one feather bed & bedstead bolster and

pillows one covered blue & white double damask & four shute one blanket & my one of Draper one Quarter Acre of land one half my best Clock & bag & all my iron & cotton & a square Walnut Table & all my provisions & furniture & my table & shute & Fifty Dollars - I leave unto my son David Moffatt my shute & my old table one covered blue horse & one half my best Clock & bag & two shute one feather bed bolster & pillow one table cloth & one shute black & all my provisions blanket & all my other shute, & one hundred & fifty Dollars - And it is my will if there is any more money left it be equally divided amongst all my children, & of lacking expects daughter & that the best of my bedens & house hold furniture, wearing cloths & shute & so provide divided amongst my daughter according to value & that my son Lewis have my Clock Case & it is my will that my daughter Margaret Moffatt be Executor & my son David Moffatt be Executor of this my last will & Testament.
