I give and bequeath to my grand son Andrew Smith the sum of eight shillings or one Dollar.

I give and bequeath to my grandson John Smith one Dollar also I give and bequeath to my grandson John Smith all my movable Property except my bed and wearing apparel.

Also I give and bequeath to my grand Daughter Catharine Anderson my bed and furniture and wearing apparel also I give and bequeath to my grandson William Smith one hundred acres of Land including the plantation where John Davis now lives but if the said Catharine Smith dies without issue the land shall return to my grandson John Smith.

I ordain my grandson John Smith Executor of this my last will and Testament in Witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written
