In the name of Our Saviour - I Matthew Dany of the County of Randolph  
and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in Body but of perfect  
mind and memory hereby bequeath give devise and assign the mortality  
of the body, and knowing that it is always appointed for all men once to die, do  
make and declare this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, in and by  
virtue of all - I give and recommend, I bequeath into the hands of my daughter  
Mary, and my son Dany, I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian  
burial, at the discretion of my Executors nothing meddling but at the general  
resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as  
touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with,  
in this last, I give, devise, and assign of the same, in the following manner,  
and thus in First, I give and bequeath to Sarah my dear wife, her whole  
two Negroes named above and Ben, Six of the richest Oxen I own in the  
place, the Wagon and Gear and two Cows and two other farming  
tools, to remain on the farm, also I give the place now here on to my wife  
during her life or Widowhood if she survives to go to my son Dany the  
above Land mentioned being in Randolph County and Chatham  
County, also I give to my wife six Cows and calves also the land  
jurisdiction and kitchen furniture, my son Dany to have the use  
of the above Land and Ben and Dany to work the Land and my son  
Dany to give his Mother the half that he makes on the Land, so that is  
made on the Land, the Son only to work in a throng of work, I also  
give and bequeath to my son John the plantation he now lives on  
price five hundred Dollars, I also give to my son Thomas four hundred  
Dollars in Money in the room of the Land that I give him and  
purchase from him again, I also give to my son Herman the  
Tract of Land he now lives on in Chatham County three hundred  
and sixty two Acres, price four hundred Dollars, I also give to  
my son Mathias the Tract of Land he now lives on being in  
Randolph County and Chatham County containing two hundred  
Acres price four hundred Dollars, I also give to my daughter  
Sarah Catharine, Anna, Susannah, and Sarah Elizabeth the  
sum of one hundred Dollars to each of my Daughters, I will  
execute, her Children to have their Mother share one hundred  
Dollars, this to be paid out of my Estate before any other share  
is made, I also devise that my two Daughters Anna, & Susannah  
have an Ox and Servitude and a Cow and Calves and two  
Pigs one Great one fat and one poor and two Cows, this to be given  
to each of them to make them even with the other, I my daughter  
that is married and left me - Susannah to have ten head of

 Dogs that by Barbara Beays some two Years old, some one Year old  
 and Ten Dogs that run about the Courtahow. Also my Ten Hens  
 to have one Egg and half, one Pew one Stallock and one Shee and  
 one pair of Geese and Officers. My Grand Son James Beay, ten  
 Yers old next Spring. All the above property with the  
 increase that is allowed to my Wife is to be equally divided among  
 my Children at my Wifes Decease or Widowhood exceptables  
 Children. I therefore make and Ordain my Ten Hens  
 Beay to my Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I  
 hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and annul all and every the  
 former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, bequests, and Executions by me in  
 any way before named, Wills and bequests whatsoever and  
 now containing this and no other, to my last Will and Testament,  
 Wills of which I have records in my hand and seal this  
 twentieth day of September in the Year of our Lord one thousand  
 Eight hundred and Twenty five, signed, sealed, published,
