 and to keep Self a Bible and two or three more for my grand Children
 that do Incline most to Read in Case if I should not Return from
 Pennsylvania if it Please god I go there I would Desire that my Daughter
 Mary Sharp should Give my son John my Bed as for my other thing
 that is More I leave it to her self to give or keep What she Likes
 of for my Son I allow them to be Divided I amongst my Children
 and Grand Children as my Executors shall see meet I Ratify
 this my last Will and Testament in the Presents of leaving my
 Son in Law Edward Sharp and my William Graham to be my
 Executors and for my Writing Twells to be Destroyed if as they
 see Cause What I Take with me I know not what may become of
