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The Last Will & Testament of John Diffe Decd.
 In the name of God Amen. I John Diffe of the County of Randolph
 & State of North Carolina being in a very low State of health but sound
 mind & memory do make and ordain this my Last Will & Testament
 First I recommend my soul unto God who give it me & my body
 to be buried in a decent Christian manner and as for my worldly
 Estate I devise in Manner following (Wit) I give & bequeath to
 my beloved Wife fifty acres of land whereon I now live & fifty acres
 more adjoining on the West between the old line of said tract & a
 tract which I purchased of John Diffe & also one parcel more
 & all the crop of every kind on said premises with her household
 of one half yielding her choice & all the hog I possess four head of sheep
 three plows, one matriock, one hoe, & also the team & two flax wheels
 and all my household & kitchen furniture during her natural
 life & after her de. the above mentioned lands to belong to my
 eldest Daughter Nelly & the other articles to be equally divided amongst
 all my Children & their issue
 And I give & bequeath to my eldest son William one hundred & sixty
 acres of land on both sides of the high branch & on both sides of deep
 River to him & to his heirs forever. And I give & bequeath to my youngest
 son John one hundred & fifty acres including the plantation whereon
 my father lived at my Mother's death & fifty acres adjoining the old tract
 to him & to his heirs forever. And I give and bequeath to my youngest
 daughter Elizabeth one hundred acres of land on the big branch the north side
 of deep River near the old tract to her & to her heirs forever
 and all the following property one Negro Woman Ellen & her child & one two
 year old horse, seven head of cattle, a Wagon, a Mill and all that belongs
 to it & a balance of plantation tools and my part of the property belonging
 to me at my Mother's death to be sold and my said eldest son
 to receive the proceeds thereof

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between my Wife & Children and at my Wife decease her part to be equally divided among my four Children & to belong to them & their heirs forever and I do acknowledge this to be my last Will & Testament revoking all others by me before made appointing each David & James Snodgrass my whole & sole Executors this 28th day of August 1803

Copy of the Last Will & Testament of Joseph Wilson Esq.

I Joseph Wilson of the County of Randolph & State of North Carolina being sick & weak of Body but of sound disposing mind & memory do make and ordain this present to contain this my Last Will & Testament in Maner as follows - -

I premise my will and desire is that all my Just debts be paid in due time

Then I give unto my two sons John and Henry Wilson the lands & Improvements whereon I now live to be divided from the river to the headline by the course of the road running along the North Side of my plantation which is nearly an east course from the river the south side to my son John and his heirs forever the North side to my son Henry Wilson to him & to his heirs forever. I also give to my son Henry Wilson one hundred & fifteen acres of land lying back of Samuel Wadsworth to him & to his heirs forever

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five hundred silver dollars and the Interest after it is collected it being part of the money I sold my land for down the country I also give my son Henry Wilson Wilson fifty dollars to be raised out of my Estate

Then I give unto my son Samuel Wilson all my land lying on the West side of Uthman river to him & to his heirs forever. I also give to my three above mentioned sons each of them a Black which they already claim my will is if either two of my sons should die without lawful issue the Survivor or Survivors to have the whole.

Then my Will and desire is that my wife Mary Chamberlaine & her heirs should have an reasonable support out of my Estate during her life

Then I leave the use of all my Works to all my Children to be decided according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter named.

Then I give unto my daughter Mary Wilson one hundred & eight

Then I give unto my daughter Abigail Wilson one hundred & eight

Then I give all the remaining part of my Estate to my two daughters Mary & Abigail Wilson to be equally divided between them and if either of them should die without lawful issue the Survivor to have the whole

Lastly I nominate behested and appoint my Executors David & James Snodgrass and Abraham Symons Executors to this my last Will & Testament to see the same fulfilled and performed in manner as above said and I do hereby ratify this & no other to be my last Will & Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 15th day of 10th Mo. 1803
