 & dispose of in the following manner and form To wit
 I'mprimis, my will is that all my debt & contracts which
 I do owe to any person or persons what soever, be well & truly
 contented and paid in convenient time and place after my
 decease — I then I give unto William Gates who was formerly
 Bound a servant to me 300 acres of land be the same more
 or less on the waters of little river joining Edw. and look to run
 and his heirs and assigns forever — I then I give unto my
 beloved wife Elizabeth Fenters one third part of my lands
 & Buildings during her natural life also one third part
 of my personal estate forever — I then I give unto my
 son Frederick Fenters his heirs and assigns forever all
 the remaining part of my estate both real and personal
 where ever to be found —

Lastly; I nominate constitute and appoint my loving
 wife Elizabeth Fenters & my son Frederick Fenters
 Executors of executor of this my last will and testament
 And I do here by utterly disallow revoke & disannul
 all and every other wills testament bequeaths and
 Executors by me in any wise before this time named
