Margaret Deborah Ann Stone and Ann Lovin, each to have a equal right
in said House and Land, and each one Twenty Dollars Cash, and the
privilege of the Room that I now live in and suitable ground and
sufficient quantity in a Garden Potato patch and Cotton patch to supply
imperfections as long as they live single. Seventh I give to my Son Robert
all the balance of my Land and Stock and all Money due me and
all my Farming utensils provided he furnishes Deborah with five
Bushels Wheat five bushels Oats, five bushels Corn and two of Cotton Yearly during
her life time, or as long as she lives single. And Lastly I appoint my
Son Robert Barker to Execute this my last Will and Testament
