I Robert Laughlin of the State of North Carolina and County of Rowan
do make and declare my last Will and Testament in the manner and
form following. My 1st I give all my best debts should be paid. 2^d I give
to my son William Laughlin One hundred and fifty Acres of Land lying
in the County of Rowan or in the Waters of Haw River one including the
plantation where he is now living. I also give him One acre Land and
Brick and One Cow. 3rd I give to my son Peckham Laughlin One hundred
and twenty Acres lying in the above named County and on the Waters of
Jackson Creek lying in a South East direction from the plantation
where I am now living also One acre Land and Brick and One Cow.
I will direct my Daughter to live with her Mother as long as she may remain
single and it shall be left to the option of his Master and the Executrix
what part he shall have & the rest he shall make each Year.
4th I give to my Son Robert Laughlin One hundred Acres of Land
lying in the above County and adjoining Peckham Laughlin's Tract
on the Waters of Jackson Creek in a South East direction from my
home plantation One hundred Acres called Seven by Name. One Brick
and one Cow. One Cow 5th I give to my Grand Daughter One hundred
Dollars. One Pound. One Bill. One Brick and Brick and one Cow.
6th I give to my dear beloved Wife Elizabeth Laughlin my home
plantation during her widowhood One Marion and One L. Head
of House all my Farming utensils. One Sett of Sheets Tools all my
House hold and Kitchen Furniture. One Bed and Bedding, and at
her death or at the end of her widowhood. all my Farming utensils
and Smith Tools to be equally divided between my two Sons. Richard
Robert, Peckham. John and Jane Laughlin all my House hold and
Kitchen Furniture to be at my wife's own disposition. 7th I give to
Jane Laughlin the third part of my home plantation
when she is 21 Years of age. One Room. Peckham and Robert and one Cow
and at the Death of Marion or my wife her third of my home
plantation to be equally divided between John and Jane Laughlin.
8th I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Laughlin One Bed and
One Cow 2 Shillings 2 Dollars and Brick and Brick and One Shilling
10th I give to my Daughter Isabel Conklin One Bed and Bedding
One Cow. 2 Shillings 2 Dollars. One Brick and Brick and Brick and
11th I give to my Daughter Jane Conklin One Bed and Bedding
One Cow. 2 Shillings 2 Dollars. One Brick and Brick and Brick and
One Shilling Wheat. 12th I give to Delicia Laughlin One Bed
and Bedding One Cow 2 Shillings 2 Dollars and Brick and

Brick and One Shilling Wheat. 13th I give to my Daughter Delicia
Laughlin One Cow and Shilling. In One 2 Shillings 2 Dollars and Brick
and Brick and Shilling. Which are other Estates may now or ever be
21 Years or when they die. Their Perishable property they take it away.
I nominate and appoint my Wife Elizabeth Laughlin and Jane Laughlin
Jointly and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all other and former Wills by me at any time heretofore made. In witness
hereof have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1st day of January in the
Year of our Lord 1827.
