for my burial I desire it may be (performed) at the discretion
of my children and my executor hereafter named who
I doubt not will manage it with all requisite prudence
as to my worldly Estate I will and positively Order
that all my Debts be paid I will bequeath to Ellenor my
Daughter one horse & Cart & Wagon and to my Daughter
Vidua one bed & table and chairs which I formerly granted
before and as for my other good and lands I bequeath to
Charles Mullin James Fisher John Gray John Ryan Bernard
I bequeath five Shillings Sterling I do constitute John
Gray my Executor and Ellenor my Daughter Executor
of this my last Will and Testaments and trustee for
my other children in which Whome I have not set my
hand and Seal this 22 Day of April in the year of our
Lord 1781.

In the name of God Amen the Testaments of Robert Jour of the County of Randolph being English and Irish in body but of the full
mind and memory bequeath to God therefore I will to mind
the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
one to die Do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
that it to my Principally and Intent of all I Give and bequeath my
soul into the hands of Almighty God that after its and my body
be committed to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the
discretion of my executor nothing doubting that at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same Again by the mighty power of God and in
this life I Give Desire and bequeath of the same in the following
manner and form -
I write my Will and Desire is that my Son Frederick Boile is to
have the Plantation of One hundred Acres of Land and he is to
maintain his father and mother during their lives and he is to have
the third of the Estate and the parts of my Estate is to be Equally divided
amongst the heirs as follows. Namely Adam Boile George Boile Thomas
John & Samuel Frederick Whymmer John Keever George Boile Thomas
I Give also to my Son Robert I Give one hundred acres of Land and
the parts of the Land he paying twenty one pounds to the Executor
and my two grand Daughters Mary and Margaret is to have and enjoy
one Equal parts with the parts of the above said heirs by themselves
to be helped and enjoyed Benjamin Rank and Thomas Whymmer
I likewise constitute make and Ordain my Executors of this
my last Will and Testaments this and no other to be my last
Will and Testaments in which Whome I have not set my hand
and Seal this day and Year above written
