Then my Will is that my last Wills and body Wills be not sold but that the same be divided by my Executor (any Thomas and Joseph I have and there alike).

Then my Will is that all my debts (both ^{and former charges} be paid out of my Estate Real and personal of the whole thereof before any Division is made therein and the Residue or Remainder of any should be in to be equally divided share and share alike amongst all my children herein before named after deducting such debts I have as before directed.

Then I do nominate constitute and Appoint my son Thomas and Samuel Executor of this my last ^{Will} and Testament and I do hereby disallow Thomas and Samuel all and every other former Will named or bequeathed confirming this and no other Will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
