AUGUST TERM 1826.

In the name of God the Father of the body of Randolph and  
State of North Carolina being advanced in Years and I mind and  
warning mind and memory believing that a greate to the removal  
of Nature my time in this World cannot be long do make this my last  
Will and Testament in Manner and form following viz - Firstly -  
I Will and direct that my body shall be decently buried and all  
my just debts and funeral expences burthened by my Executor  
herein after named. Secondly I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Anna  
for me during her life of the whole sum of £1000 with the remainder I  
vesting out my Estate in that parcell of my Beloved Anna should  
not live with and remaine to her as in inheritance by this Will, but in Case my  
said wife should die my then give and bequeath to her only son half  
of my personal property - Thirdly I give and bequeath my slaves  
unto my Nephew Samuel Edwards (son of Lazarus Edwards) who now  
live with me, and has for several Years done me great service  
and assistance all my personal property and real Estate reserving a  
life time right or comfortable habitation out of the same for my wife I  
provided she lives single but in Case she should die my then give  
to the said Samuel Edwards one half of all my personal Estate with or  
what is hereafter otherwise bequeathed and devine to him the whole of my  
real Estate - It is further to be understood that the intention of this  
Will is, that during the Marriage of my said wife Anna & herself  
her and my said Matthew shall live together in my house and jointly  
hold, enjoy and keep together my property as far as is practicable during  
her life or Matrooshop as the case may be so that she may be free  
of a comfortable support, and that he the said Samuel Edwards may  
have the whole that is left after her death or what is hereby intimated  
for him in Case of her Marriage or otherwise I give and bequeath
