of fine shape. And one half of the barn.

2^d I give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Rachel Morgan, a grey
cow, & a feather bed, for her to enjoy & fully possess.

Also I give & bequeath to my beloved son John Morgan, a certain batch
of said Gray Hens, at Christmas. Also, a pair of black Kridles, working
tools, wearing apparel, & for him fully to enjoy & possess.

I do hereby disavow, & revoke all & every other former Testament, Will
Legacies, Bequests, & Bequests, by me in any way before a made, &
disavowed. Ratifying, & confirming this & no other, to be my
last & Testament. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my

being through the abundant mercy and goodness of God
becoming to mind that it is appointed for all men to die do hereby
testify this my last will and testament And desire it to be received
by all as such and teaching such words as I shall write with it to be
perused & to be kept in my will in this present life I give
Revise and dispose of the same in manner and form following
First. I bid to my wife Parker my wife for term of life the
one of part of the tract of land I purchased of John Trim brought
whereon I now live being east of the Meadows Branch And
North of the Spring branch I except three acres of land where the
house and other buildings stand to the said land. I also land
Mary Ann Negroes named — I have two young ones & one
for reason I do so is for her good conduct and kind usage
I give to the hire of Elizabeth Morgan the sum of
five pounds current money
I give to my daughter Mary I owe four Negroes named
Viter Mowah Name & Chapman
I give to my daughter Gineal Harper three negroes
named Mingo, Hannah & Jude. And also five hundred
pounds current money
I give to my daughter Sarah Campbell two tracts of
land lying in Bowen County one held by States dead
known by the name of Guillen, & the other
held by her from her son in law. I give to
Sarah three Negroes named Joseph Lewis and
Lucas And also five hundred pounds current
money

I give to my son Solomon Parker that part of the tract
of land I purchased of John Trim brought that I did not
send away my wife and other debts against one held
by and from William Pickett one other tract held by
and I purchased at public Vendue confiscated property
of Henry Little one other tract held by and from
William Little one other tract held by and from John Thomas Harper

Also two other tracts lying in Newnan County one tract of land
 Aired known by the name of Mow and Place the other half
 by deed from Nantz and also all the land I hold on the
 East Side of Hambis Creek lying between Mow and Place I
 Also give to my son Solomon Parker twenty Negroes named
 Dimprie, Muzzie, Mow, Daniel, Isaac, Robt Peter Dennis
 Saturday Young, Orion & Valentine Francis Lucie, Jenny Biron
 Will also and a little Kanaka and a boy I also give after
 my debts being paid to my son Solomon Parker all the rest
 of the gold, silver & paper currency that I have

 give the said and all the other property I lent her to my
 son Solomon Parker I likewise make and Ordain my
 Solomon Parker and my trusty friend Lettice
