Copy of the last will and testament of Thomas Jenkins Decd.

I know all men by, parents that I Thomas Jenkins  
of Randolph County & State of North Carolina Planter  
Being infirm in body, but of sound and disposing  
mind & memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty  
of this life do make & ordain this day to be my  
last will and testament

In primis I will & command that my body be  
Dignitely interred & that my funeral expences  
together with all my just debts be fully paid  
at the discretion of my Executors here after named.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizard  
the Jenkins her maintenance or support during her  
natural life the inheritance of the said may be  
on the plantation where I now reside.

Item I bequeath unto my son Thomas Jenkins &  
part of the tract of land on which I live the precise  
quantity not known but lying and being on the  
South side of said tract and bounded by a branch  
known by the name of the ~~old~~ branch to him this  
time former.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Jenkins  
the residue

My land and what horses & cattle also my plantation  
tools & farming utensils I may die possessed of to the  
use & benefit of him & his heirs for ever reserving an  
exception only to my wife as above mentioned her support  
out of his part & liberty for my daughters that are  
single. Namely, Ann Jenkins, Martha Jenkins,  
Sarah Jenkins & Rachel Jenkins to reside on the  
plantation with their Brother John if they chuse  
to incline so long as they live single and that  
each of them shall have an equal proportion with  
this Sister Ruth, Weston & Mary May until otherwise  
have already given what I intend.

I give and bequeath unto my wife Martha Jenkins  
all my household furniture and the residue of my estate not  
already disposed of of every kind and nature to have & to hold  
to her & her heirs forever. And lastly I constitute & appoint  
my two sons John Jenkins & Thomas Jenkins executors of  
this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof  
I have signed & set my hand and affixed my seal  
this twelve day of the fourth month one thousand eight  
hundred and one.
