Copy of the last will and testament of Thomas Jenkins Decd.

Know all men by presents that I Thomas Jenkins of Randolph County & State of North Carolina Planter Being infirm in body but of sound and disposing mind & memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life do make & ordain this my last will and testament

In witness I will & ordain that my body be decently interred & that my funeral expences together with all my just debts be fully paid at the discretion of my Executors here after named.

I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah the Jenkins the maintenance or support during her natural life for widowhood as the law may be on the plantation where I now reside.

I do bequeath unto my son Thomas Jenkins a part of the tract of land on which I live the precise quantity not known but lying and being on the south side of said tract and bounded by a branch known by the name of the branch to him &c his heirs forever.

I do give & bequeath unto my son John Jenkins the residue

coming from Virginia of my part of a certain
tract of land lying on Smiths Creek and I give and
bequeath all the rest of my right, title and Interest
to be equally divided between my sister Ann Sheaw
and my brother James Sheaw and I renounce all other
will or will before this above will. May 9th 1807.

out of his part & liberty for my daughters that are
single. Namely Ann Jenkins Martha Jenkins
Letitia Jenkins & Rachel Jenkins to reside on the
Plantation with their brother John if they should
be inclined as long as they live single and that
each of them shall have an equal portion with
their sisters Ruth, Rebecca & Mary Mary unto whom I
have already given what I intend.

Then I give and bequeath unto my wife Martha Sheaw
all my household furniture and the residue of my estate not
already disposed of of every kind and nature to have the same
to her & her heirs forever. And lastly I constitute Saffard
my true love John Jenkins & Thomas Jenkins Executors of
this my last will and testament. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this twelfth day of the fourth month one thousand eight
hundred and one.
