With his prying of these persons current money of the State of North Carolina to his brother here named Thomas Pugh, and the like sum of three hundred dollars to his sister Annah Walker.

I will & give and devise to my son John Pugh one hundred & eight acres of land where he now dwelleth with the appurtenances to him & his heirs forever with his saying his brother Thomas Pugh, these persons current money of North Carolina, and I make & ordain him my son James Pugh my sole executor of this my last Will & Testament in trust for the intent, & purpose as this my Will contained in writing whereof I the said Thomas Pugh do here to this my last will & Testament set my hand & seal the day & yeare signed sealed & delivered by the said Thomas Pugh as and this last will & Testament in the presence Thomas Pugh, & of us who were present at the saying & sealing.
