 Body, but of sound, sober and disposing mind and memory
 do make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last
 Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to
 say, first I give and recommend my Soul to God who gave it
 and my Body to the Earth, to be decently interred by my Executors
 hereinafter named. And as to such earthly Goods as it hath
 pleased the Almighty to bless me with, my Will is that it
 shall be disposed of in the following manner, First, I
 bequeath unto Mary Wood, my dear and beloved Wife,
 all my Estate both real and Personal (except such part of
 the property as I may think not necessary for her comfortable
 support) during the term of her natural life, and such
 property as she may not wish to keep, my Will is that it shall
 be sold by my Executors. Second. My Will is that after
 the death of my said Wife all my Estate both real and
