Then convened at the house of John Hammer Dec^d Tobias Hendricks Charles Cox Esq^s J^r & M^r Cox agreed to an order made by said county Court at Augth term 1815 And proceed to business after being duly sworn qualified; as empowered by said order to appraise to the widow of said Hammer provisions for one year which is as follows -

And after mature consideration we all hereby agree that the said widow shall have for her support for one year the whole crop now on hand which is about two acres of Corn 5 Bushels of Rye a small quantity of flax and Cato a small Cotton & potatoe patch - And of the stock one heifer a two year old and milked cow and calf and another cow and calf to be in her possession for one year and then to be sold - And two pounds of Coffee and 10^{lb} of sugar And to keep her said lands the rate above written
