

20) Know all men by these presents that William Boyd of Charlotte County and State of North Carolina for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds of good and lawful money of the State advanced to me in hand paid by Shiloh Wright of the County and State aforesaid gentleman whereof I do acknowledge the receipt and myself thus with fully satisfied have bargained sold let conveyed and delivered and by these presents in plain and open market according to the due form of law do bargain sell and deliver unto the said Shiloh Wright one negro boy named Will several years old to have and to hold the said negro boy unto the said Shiloh Wright his heirs executors and assigns for ever and I the said William Boyd for myself my executors the said bargained negro boy unto the said Shiloh Wright his heirs executors and assigns against all and all manner of persons shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents provided nevertheless that if I the said William Boyd my executors or assigns one or any of us do or shall will and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Shiloh Wright his heirs executors or assigns the sum of forty pounds on the last day of December which shall be in the year of our Lord 1788 for the Redemption of the said negro boy that then present Writing or bill of sale to be read or after stand in full force and effect in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 19 day of November one thousand seven hundred and eighty five signed sealed & delivered in the presence of us
