 manner whatsoever also full power and Authority in my Name
 and for me to sell alien convey & make over by Deed to any
 person or persons whatsoever all or any part of my land in
 Randolph County State of North Carolina. Given & granted with
 power strength and authority in & about the premises
 to have use and take all lawfull ways & means in my Name for the recovery of any
 money that is or may be due me by the sale of my land or otherwise. & upon
 the receipt of any such debt due or sum of money as aforesaid acquittance or other
 sufficient discharge for me & in my Name to Make Seal and Deliver. and pay
 all & every other out and out Money & things due or owing on the land
 whatsoever hereof and thereunto to be paid in and about the premises for
 and in my Name to do execute & perform as fully largely & amply as all
 present. Nothing allowing and compromising whatsoever my said attorney shall
 lawfully do in and about the premises by virtue hereof. In witness whereof

 two lots of land in the State of North Carolina. Randolph County North Carolina being her & chief part of land
 to him and his heirs own use & benefit forever. I give and bequeath to my loving daughter
 all that tract of land whereon I live. being three separate tracts making in the whole. Six hundred &
 forty acres of land to him & his heirs forever. and also my Negro woman known by the
 name of Moll after his Mother because for him & his heirs forever. If my Son Stephen should
 die without issue the whole effect to be the property of my Son William to him & his heirs forever
 this I do give the whole effect to be the property of my Son William to him & his heirs forever
 this I give of away in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety eight
