being weak of Body but of sound mind & memory
& knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
die, do make & ordain this my last will & testament
in the manner following (Viz) first I give and
bequeath my soul to god that gave it, & my Body to
the dust from whence it was taken, then I bequeath
that all my Just debts be paid & the remainder of my
Estate to be divided in the manner following—
then I give & bequeath to my son John the sum of
five Shillings, then I give & bequeath to my Daugh-
ter Elizabeth the sum of five Shillings, then I give
& bequeath to my son William the sum of five
Shillings, then I give & bequeath to my son David
the sum of five Shillings, then I give & bequeath to my
son Robert the sum of five Shilling. I also give &
bequeath to my son Samuel the plantation
I now live on containing 210 acres with his paying
to a Mary & Sam thirty Dollars cash, then I give
& bequeath to my Daughter Mary & my Daughter
Ann, all my moveable property except my bed
& furniture which I give & bequeath to my son
Robert, then I appoint my son Samuel my sole
Executor to this my last will & testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
this thirtieth day May in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred & twelve —
