sents that I Mary Hill of
Randolph County being weak of body
the place of said widow being weak of body
out of sound and disposing mind & memory do
think proper to make and ordain these presents to
contain my last will & testament in the following
manner I form & say First my will is that all my debts

be paid in convenient time after my decease out of my
Estate by my Executors -

good & then I give said horse to my daughter Margaret
Bandy also one feather bed & covering, one large brass kettle
one Coffy Mill one Note for thirty two dollars fifty two
cents in Henry Pearson two quarter Brooms three quarter

Item I give to my daughter Rachel Lee one feather bed and
furniture curtains &c one large pot one Note on Pearson
& Hill for forty dollars one Cash & W. Lewis that I have sold
them for thirteen dollars also one large basin & dish and one
quarter Stave - one Stock Buss -

Item I give to my son Isaac Hill all that I have and have
ought the large pot, one Can & bottles I give to him

Item I give to my son Nathan Hill one Brown Kipper &
Eight Dollars that I have and have sold for

Item I give to my son Robert Hill Eight Dollars to be paid
out of my Estate

Item I give to my two daughters Margaret Bandy and Rachel
Lee after the legacies the balance of my property

Item I likewise nominate constitute and appoint my two
sons Sam^l and Aaron Hill Executors to this my last
will & testament and I hereby wishing & recommending
all and every other will in witness whereof I have here-
unto set my hand this 14th day of February, 1816
