Copy of William Williams Will

I William Williams of Randolph County and State of North Carolina being of Sound mind and Memory do this fifth day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen Hundred and Nine, Make and Ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament. In manner and form as follows

First of all to my Will and Desire that all my Just Debts be paid out of my estate, I give & bequeath to my beloved wife all my land and Tenements during her life also all my other property for her to Dispose of as she has proper and after her death that my son Benjamin have all the land with the Plantation on which I now live that lies on the West and on the South East sides of Little river I give and bequeath to my son Jacob all the land that I now own between horses fork and Little River

I give unto my son William Williams, Jonathan Rachel Mary Ann Sarah and James Each two Shillings Sterling. I hereby make and Ordain my worthy friend John Presnal Junr & And Dollenhade Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day and year above written signed sealed & published by the said William Williams the Testator as his last Will and Testament, In presence of us who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof
