In the Name of God, Amen I William Bell, of the County of Randolph, State of North Carolina being weak
in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory I beseech ye God for his Mercies to make me
Master Bell & Testament in Marion & Form following. First to say in the first place, I command my
Soul to God who gave it. My body to the Earth from whence it came with confidence that though the
Worms of Jesus Christ they will be buried at the General Resurrection and as to such worldly goods as
Earthly things God to bless me with I do will and direct that they shall be disposed of as follows
Firstly, I will & do will that all my Earthly funeral charges shall be paid and done as convenient to my
Friends & Relations hereafter named. Secondly, In addition to what I have hitherto given to my wife
wife Children & Grandchildren to wit, John Bellborn & his children Susannah & Mandabell, John
Bell & his children, known as you now do & his children William & Mary, Son & his Children
I do give & bequeath to the aforesaid former & the whole of my Neighbors which I now have (Death,
Sarah) to be divided equally amongst the said families as circumstances will permit
so as that it separate the Husband, & wives of said persons at a great distance from each other
In proportion of land, slaves, which may fall to the share of Sarah Mandabell, I give unto her
during her life and at her death to be disposed of as she may direct of such slaves as may fall
to the share of Sarah Bellborn, I give & bequeath to her during her life and at her death to
descend to her Children I do also give & bequeath unto the said families above named one
third part of all my other personal Estate that is not heretofore particularly devised to others
I do will & direct that the said Neighbors & personal property shall be divided in such a way
as may do equal Justice to each of the said families. Thirdly, I give & bequeath unto William
Bellborn my black, Fourthly, I give & bequeath unto Joseph Bellborn my old desk & trunk case
Fifthly, I give & bequeath unto Susannah Bellborn my caning Table, Chair in the lifetime of
Sarah Bell. Given to him my child Sixthly, I give & bequeath unto John Bellborn during
life the use of the Plantation House. Wherever she now lives, Seventhly, I give & bequeath unto John
Bellborn the Plantation House his mother now lives, Reserving to her the use of the house during
during her life Eighthly, I give & bequeath unto my dear Nephew, John Bell son of my
Mother & William Bell son of my Brother Nathl. Five thousand acres of Land to his my
will Slave labor, my negroes, Pigs & My land, adjoining on the East side of the River the
middle land place, the old Court House place my lands which lies between the Court House &
Thomas Smith place & the plantation known George Adams now lives to be jointly owned
held between them as friends in common. I also give & bequeath unto the said John
Bell & William Bell my two belloys brothers which has never yet been used. It is to be

Understood that the said John Bell is not to come in with his wife for any part of my
personal property. Ninthly, I give & bequeath unto the children of my brother John Bell my
Kings plantation containing three hundred & thirty acres, the land known as Robert Clark & Abrah
Smith formerly lived containing three hundred & eighty one acres & the one acre tract of land
containing four hundred acres known by the name of the Black house tract & also one fourth of
two thirds of all my my other personal property to the heirs particularly named to be equally divided
amongst them three & three alike. Tenthly, I give & bequeath unto my Nephew William Bell &
his children one fourth of the said parts of all my other personal property not having
otherwise disposed of to the aforesaid amongst his children at his death as in this provision
Eleventhly, I give & bequeath unto my Sister in law Rachel Bell widow of John Bell and
her four Daughters, one fourth of the said parts of all my personal property not
otherwise disposed off to be divided amongst them three & three alike. Twelfthly, I give
& bequeath unto my Nephew Robert Bell the land known as the house tract & those lands
I now occupy containing four hundred & fifteen acres or there abouts, my tract of three
hundred & one acres known by the name of the Green Place & also two hundred & twenty
acres adjoining the same known by the name of the Hunting house tract I also give & bequeath
unto my dear Nephew Robert Bell my house desk & one fourth of the said parts of all the rest of my
personal property not having otherwise disposed of. Thirteenthly
I will & direct that nothing so humanly convenient shall not be omitted as I may see
longer or shorter time. I do hereby appoint my friend Robert Bell my Nephew & William Bell my
brother to take care of the said Livernash Esq; that he is completely provided for in the said
estate. It is my further will that those who have the power of my negroes will have
reference to a will made by my late wife Maria Bell & in the Division Conform as
nearly to her wishes as circumstances & our Justice to the posterity to whom I have bequeathed
such property. To this I do hereby disclaim any Right & Title to the Negroes left
belonging to me & those be given to them further than what I mean to be paid for said Post
& I do hereby will & direct that the said slaves shall be emancipated as soon and can be
legally effected & the lands Conveyed to the said slaves, provided they conduct
themselves in a proper manner & I do hereby appoint my friend John Bell
trustee to administer the property of said Estate & prevent it from being wasted or
applied otherwise than to the said Negroes. And I do hereby nominate & appoint my
Nephew Robert Bell & Stephen William Bellborn Executor of this my last will & Testament
& in case they should want any advice or assistance in executing the same I request them
to call on my friend Alexander Gray who has promised at my request to give wise
advice in his power and the said William Bell exec. publisher & editor of the my test
will & Testament working & managing by these presents all bills by me before made
in witness whereof the said William Bell have hereunto set my hand & signed my seal
This day second day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
