State of North Carolina, Know all men by these presents Randolph County, that I Beverly Galliatte of the County and State aforesaid Farmer being what of Body but of sound mind and memory, do think proper to make this my last Will and Testament in the disposal of such World's Estate whereunto it hath pleased God to bless me with in the following manner and form. Viz. 1st That my Body should be buried in decent or as near my desires. 2^d My Will is that all my last debts be paid in convenient time after my decease by my Executor hereafter named. 3^d Then, I give unto my Grand Daughter Polly Brown One Feather Bed and Furniture. 4th I give unto my Daughter Dicy Howard five Shillings Current Money. 5th I give to my Daughter Nancy Vaughan five Shillings Current Money. 6th I give unto my Son James Galliatte five Shillings Current Money of this State. 7th I give unto my Daughter Amy Gausey five Shillings Current Money of this State. 8th I give unto my Son Beverly Galliatte One Negro Man named Paul now in my possession. 9th Then, I give unto my Daughter Polly Wade one Negro Woman by the name of Anahy which was past in her possession. 10th I give unto my Son William Galliatte five Shillings Current Money. 11th I give unto my Daughter

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Rachel Lutter five Shillings Current Money. 12th I give unto my Son Samuel Galliatte five Shillings Current Money, also one Negro Girl by the name of Sam. 13th Then, I give my Negro Woman by the name of Betty her personal dress to me and my heirs for ever, and my Will is that at the next General Assembly or Session Court of this County after my decease that she be sold by the sheriff according to Law for her services to me and my family. 14th Then, I leave Twenty Dollars in the care of my Executors hereafter named in the sum of carrying the expenses which may occur in obtaining my Negro Woman Betty's freedom in Court or otherwise, and be the highest of my old Negro Woman Sam. 15th And Lastly my Will is that after all the Legacies are paid out and the Expenses in the support of my old Negro Woman Sam and other necessary expenses are paid I give to my Grand Daughter Polly Brown the balance of my estate whomever to be bound. I nominate Governor and aforesaid my Executors John Black and one Benjamin Cookshire Executors to this my last Will and Testament Watching and Confirming this and no other to contain my last Will and Testament, in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal June the 9th day 1824.
