In the name of God Amen I Jacob Harman being in a low State of Health but of a sound mind & memory bless be God, do this 30th day of October 1822. doth make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in the following manner, that is to say, my Debts and Funeral Expenses to be paid first. I give and bequeath to my loving Wife all my Lands, two Slaves the Day & Black, my Stock of Horses and Dogs & Sheep except such as I hereafter mention & all household furniture during her life as Widowhood.

2^d I give & bequeath to my Son Leonard Fifty Dollars. 3^d I give and bequeath my Daughter Sarah Twenty Dollars. 4th I give and bequeath my Son Liza Fifty Acres Land whereon he lives by him paying each Fifty Dollars. 5th I give and bequeath my Son Jacob Fifty Dollars meaning the fifty that to be paid by Liza. 6th I give & bequeath my Son William fifty Cents. 7th I give and bequeath my Son Israel fifty Cents. 8th I give & bequeath my daughter Mary Twenty Dollars. And I give, Let of Peter Plates Dish and Basin.

9th I give & bequeath my Daughter Elizabeth Twenty Dollars. And I give let Peter Plates dish & Basin. 10th I give & bequeath to my Son Israel Fifty Dollars & some worth Twenty five Dollars & a Cattle. 11th I give & bequeath my Daughter Liza Twenty Dollars. And I give & bequeath equal to the other two. 12th I give & bequeath to my Daughter Frances Twenty Dollars. And I give and Peter as above. 13th I give and bequeath my Son George Fifty Dollars & a Day Slave called Billy, Fyga & Paddy, the four last named I wish to be paid their parts in Silver that is now in hand at the death of my Widow, I wish the property equally divided between all my Children, the Stock and Wagon to be sold for the purpose of schooling the Young Children or any thing the Widow think proper to sell for the use of the family. I make and declare my two Sons Liza and Israh Executors to this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I set my hand and seal the day and Year first above Written.

 I give to my Daughter Mary Barker Dec'd Ten Shillings. Fifth
 I give to my Grandson Samuel Barker Son of Hannah Cairns all that land
 East of a line beginning at a White Oak on my East line running nearly
 North to a Red Oak, then a straight line to a White Oak, corner on my
 West line, North I give my Daughters namely, Dorcas, Elizabeth,
 Margaret, Deborah Newby and one Lora, each to have a equal right
 in said House and Lora, and each one Twenty Dollars Cash, and the
 privilege of the House that I now live in and suitable ground and
 sufficient quantity for a Garden, Potato patch and other patch to support
 themselves as long as they live single, I give to my Son Robert
 all the balance of my Land and Stock and all Moneys due me, and
 all my Farming utensils provided he furnishes Deborah with five
 Bushels Wheat, five pounds of Sugar and two of Apples yearly during
 her life time, or as long as she lives single, And lastly I appoint my
 Son Robert Barker to Execute this my last Will and Testament
 in Witness hereof I set my hand and seal this 5th day of August
 1823.
