but of sound and perfect memory thank be to almighty God and  
belling to Remembrance the frailty and uncertainty of human life  
have made this my last will and testament following I give and  
commit my soul into the hands of my merciful Creator hoping  
for the redemption of my sins through the merits of my blessed Redeemer  
Jesus Christ. my body I leave to be buried at the discretion of  
my Executors hereafter named. and as to my Estate both real & personal I  
leave in the following manner. First my Debt is that all my Just Debt  
be honestly paid, and that Mr. Rindles, a fellow Ship Passenger land now  
Improvement to my beloved Wife, Mother & Son, during her natural life &  
at his Decease I give it to my two Son, viz. William Rindles & Wood  
I give to my Daughter Mary that to her two Shillings & six pence  
Lawful currency of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina to her & her heirs for ever. I then I give  
to my Daughter Sarah that to her two Shillings & six pence Lawful  
money of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina to her & her heirs for ever. I then I give to  
Daisy that to her two Shilling. & six pence Lawful money of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina  
to her & her heirs for ever. I then I give to my Son Russell  
Wood two Shillings & six pence Lawful money of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina  
to him and his heirs for ever. I then I give to my Son Francis that  
two shillings and six pence Lawful money of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina to  
him and his heirs for ever I then I give and bequeath to a  
Daughter namely Tucker two shillings and six pence Lawful  
Money of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina I then I give to my Daughter Darius  
Kembell half a Crown to her & her heirs for ever I then I give  
and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Wood feather bed  
furniture and one cow and half to her and her heirs  
for ever I then I give to my Daughter baby Wood one feather  
bed and furniture one cow and half to her and her heirs  
for ever I then I give unto my wife all the rest of my estate  
both real and personal not being here before mentioned

in it her and her heirs forever. making up all  
former wills made by me do appoint my beloved wife  
Martha Wood, Executrix and my son William Kendrick Wood &  
son Kendrick Wood. Executors of this my last will & testament  
acknowledging this to be my only last will and testament  
in which I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
this 13<sup>th</sup> day of May 1801

Health & Patient but in my Proper mind and Memory  
having a Mind to make my last will and testament of God  
I should call me hence I first Commaund my Soul to God who  
have it and ~~my~~ Body to be buried in Christian manner and  
first I have my truly friend Edward York and I shall  
York my Executors to settle my Affairs first my Debt that all  
just Debt be paid and all that is owing to me to be  
collected I do leave to my beloved wife Ellen the house & live  
in and the furniture that is in it and the third of the  
Plantation During her life and then at her death to my  
son Vernon and one third to my son William and one  
third to my son John and to my son fifty five shillings  
and my Daughter Anne five shillings and my Daughter  
Abigail five shillings and my Daughter Shudana five  
shillings and my Daughter Nancy five shillings  
and my Daughter Mary five shillings and to my  
Daughter Sarah five shillings and I desire that  
there should be a Landue made and sell my block  
and Smith tools and all my stock and farming  
Utensils and after my just Debt are paid settle  
the ballance to be Divided Equally between Ellen  
and Edward no more but leaves them in the  
Care of Divine Providence given under my  
hand and seal as my last will and testament  
this 19<sup>th</sup> Day of February 1804
