In the name of God Amen, I Gideon Wood, of the County
 of Randolph and State of North Carolina, being weak of
 Body, but of sound, sober and disposing mind and memory
 do make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last
 Will and Testament, in manner and form following, that is to
 say, first I give and recommend my Soul to God who gave it
 and my Body to the Earth, to be decently interred by my Executors
 hereinafter named. And as to such earthly Goods as it hath
 pleased the Almighty to bless me with, my Will is that it
 shall be disposed of in the following manner, First, I
 bequeath unto Mary Wood, my dear and beloved Wife,
 all my Estate both real and Personal (except such part of
 the property as I may think not necessary for her comfortable
 support) during the term of her natural life, and such
 property as she may not wish to keep, my Will is that it shall
 be sold by my Executors. Second. My Will is that after
 the death of my said Wife all my Estate both real and
 personal, shall be sold by my Executors, and the proceeds
 thereof, together with the proceeds of the sale of such property
 as may not be kept by my said Wife, also all moneys
 that may come into their hands for debts due, shall be divided
 amongst my Children in the following way (Viz.) One tenth
 part to each of my Children now named, Gideon Wood,
 Joseph Wood, Mary Lane, John Wood, Robert Wood, Nancy
 Elliott, Samuel Wood, My Doak, and Sarah Kirkman -
 the other tenth part, my Will is shall be disposed of in the
 following way - In consideration of the care and attention, that
 Mary Lane has bestowed upon Gideon Wood my late son

who has been and is yet helpless and a cripple; my Will is that the said
 Mary Lane shall receive out of the said tenth part (which would have
 been the said Gideon's part upon an equal division) the sum of One
 Hundred Dollars per Year in the time she has kept him and shall continue
 to keep him, should he continue to be so much afflicted as he is at present,
 until the whole of the said tenth part shall be expended. My Will further
 is that all my Executors account for advancements made to them, and that
 John Wood shall receive in Ninety five Dollars. Thirdly, Should the
 said Gideon Wood die before the whole amount of the said tenth
 part of my Estate shall be expended, then the remaining part to be
 divided equally amongst my Children. Lastly, I do hereby nominate
 Joseph Wood and a private Samuel Wood and John Kirkman Executors
 to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal the 2^d day of June A.D. 1824,
 Signed, Sealed, Pronounced, Published,
 and declared by the said Gideon Wood
 to be his last Will and Testament, in the
 presence of us who in the presence of the said
