I also wish all my just debts to be settled up out of my estate by my executors and I do hereby constitute and appoint my worthy friends Benjamin Witty and John Winchester Junr to be my full and sole executors and no other of this my last will and testament and I do hereby revoke and make void all former

wills and testaments by me heretofore made in 230

I give and bequeath to my brother John Moore or his heirs the sum of fifty dollars and no more. I give and bequeath to my brother Samuel Moore or his heirs the sum of fifty dollars in cash and no more. I give and bequeath to my brother David Moore or his heirs fifty dollars in cash and no more.
