my plantation till my wife decease and then an
area between my two sons John Smith and
Smith so repeating my wishes for the prosperity of
man kind in temporal and also eternal prosper-
ity I here unto again affie my son their 18th day
of July AD 1822.

In the name of God amen I Hugh le Stubblefield of
the state of north Carolina and County of Rockingham
being weak in body but of sound mind and memory
blessed be god to make and ordain this my last will
and testament in the following manner first it my
will and desire that my body be decently buried by my
friends and relations and commit my soul into the
hands of God who giveth it me I desire that all debts
due to me be collected and all my just debts be paid
and all I have left I dispose of in the following man-
ner first I leave unto my beloved wife Frances Stubb-
lefield all my whole estate real and personal during
her natural life and the following restrictions viz
this my will and desire that she keep full possession
of the whole estate together with all the children and sup-
port herself and them I give them a good English
education on the profits & gains come of my ^{said} estate or
property until they come of age and then as soon
as my daughter Matilda Ann Vernon Stubble-
field comes of age and leaves her mother it is my
will and desire that she take full possession of the
same that I bought of Oakley Jones and my half
& whott is commonly called the little mill on Burn-
hills fork for herself her heirs or assigns forever and
such part of the negro stock or house hold per-
niture as my beloved wife may see cause to give
her not disfurnishing herself next I give unto
my son John Myatt Stubblefield when he comes
of age and leaves his mother the full liberty or
priviledge to take possession of any part of my land
whereon I lie containing about five hundred &
fifty five acres more or less lying to the south side
& a line to be run between him and his sister
Catherine beginning at a hickory on the west

the west bank of said Island back a corner between
Jeremiah French and my self where formerly stood a
house now corner and running through my land an
eastly course so as to divide it equally in quantity
between them I say he take possession of any of the
wood land above mentioned on the south of said
line and improve for himself not interrupting his
mother during her life in the improvements now made
or timber firewood &c also he shall have one third
part of the clear profits of the mill as long as his
mother lives and afterwards half and his sister
Catherine the other half and he shall also have any
part of the negro stock or household furniture
his mother may see cause to give him at her discretion
not suspending herself and most I give my execu-
tive Catherine Stubblefield when she comes of
age and leaves her mother all the residue or remain-
der of my land where I live to the north of the above
mentioned line to be run on the same line as
my brother Wm not interrupting his mother during
her life about timber firewood &c and also one
third of the mill during his mother life after that
half of the mill forever with his brother and also
from hundred or odd dollars besides to make her leave
equal in improvements with his brothers and such
part of the negroes stock or household furniture as
his mother may see cause to give her and further if
it should so happen that my wife should have an
other child within the time prescribed by law at
my decease that such child shall have an equal
part in value with the rest of my chattel above
named it is also my will and desire that my beloved
wife sell the two stots and such part of the stock
and my other things that she may accumulate

un necessary to keep for the family and put the money
on account until the child reaches age I also
give to my beloved wife my gig and my cart and
team and all the plantation tools & Harry County
tute and appoint my beloved wife my beloved
friend John Sinary Executive and executor of this
my last will and testament in testimony whereunto
I have unto set my hand and seal this sixth day
of August in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and twenty one Liguor seal'd and
witnessed in presence of Hugh Stubblefield
James Railey Richard Stubblefield James Grant
State of North Carolina Roanoke Co Novembe 1821.
