 to my beloved son James Anderson my best suit
 of clothes and great coat I leave and bequeath to
 my son John Boak all my farming utensils and
 all my claim of cattle and my bed and furniture
 to my grandson William Boak. I appoint and or-
 dain Robert Barr and John Owen Junior to be my lawful
 Executors to do Justice to the Legals as witness my
 hand and seal this 12th day of December 1803
