In the name of God Amen I Jackson Lynn being of sound mind and memory but like all other men being liable to the fate of humanity and must die I therefore make this my last will and testament I desire that my body be buried in a decent chris-
like manner.

2^d I give and bequeath to my beloved Mother Elizabeth Lynn one negro boy Spencer one Negro Girl named Harriet & one by name Caroline and at her decease for the above named negroes to ascend to my Brother Bagley Lynn with their increase.

3^d I Give to my mother the tract of land which I purchased of George McBlain during her life and at her death I Give and bequeath the same with the tract where on my mother now lives to my brother Bagley.

4th I Give and bequeath to my mother the sum of money which I own. 5th I desire for my Mother and Brother to have the use of my wardrobe between them.

6th I Give and bequeath to my Brother Bagley one negro Girl named Lucia

7th I Give and bequeath unto my Mother five hundred dollars

8th I Give and bequeath unto my brother Bagley my bay mare.

9th I Give and bequeath unto my brother Bagley my tract of land known by the crop

road ten or eleven acres more or less.

10th I Give ~~money~~ bequeath to my brother Bagley seven hundred dollars.

11th At my mother's death I Give and bequeath my right title and interest in

a negro boy Sam & a Girl Paty to my brother Bagley.

12th My will and desire is that my

Wife in possession my interest in the stock and house furniture during her life and at

her death for the same to go to my brother

Bagley. 13th I Give and bequeath to my

another one mule. 14th I nominate Brother Bagley executor of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my set my hand and affixed my seal. This 2^d day of February 1829 signed sealed and published in the presence of

In the name of God Amen I John Boak of the County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina being much indisposed with & infirm in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given be given to God. Calling to memory the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die do make & publish this my last will & Testament. Viz

I Give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Boak my Negro girl Dinah and all my house hold furniture & plantation tools to hold the Girl Dinah absolutely but the household furniture & plantation tools

to be Equally divided with my little Daughter Peggy
Hinson when she arrives at age I also give to my beloved
wife one half my stock and the other half to be
sold with my Waggon to pay my just debts I
also give to my beloved wife the whole of my present
crop to dispose of as she pleases & one tract of land
containing two hundred acres known by the name
of the old tract where my dwelling house now stands
and one small tract of land lying on big Trout
lesome creek which I give to her to hold with her to
have and to hold during her natural life & no longer
except my daughter Peggy should die & I have no
other by my wife. And I give to my afflicted son William
Boat one Negro boy named George & one tract of land
containing two hundred acres & through by the
name of the new entry & one bed & furniture to
be held & managed not by himself but by
a guardian appointed by Court & under the
of my executor so left in this instrument and
such estate so left to be managed to the best
advantage for the comfortable support of my
afflicted son William Boat during his natural life &
it is my will that the residue of the said property
or its income if any such there be at the death of the
said William Boat shall go to my little daughter
Peggy Hinson & her heirs to be by the
her possessed as a donation from me.

It is my will that if there be a balance of the
proceeds of my Waggon & the one half of my stock
when sold after paying off all my just
debts I wish it to be applied to the support
of my afflicted son William Boat under the
restrictions above mentioned & again it is
my will & desire that the whole of my Negro
shall be possessed by my beloved wife & her
Boat except the boy George above mentioned

partnership with my little daughter Peggy Hinson
as my gift during her natural life & should
she have any more children by me I assign
that share that she & they be there number
more or less should still have equal shares of
the said Negroes. I wish however the division
of said Negroes should not be made until my
my daughter Peggy Hinson arrives at
the age in law. but I desire it to be distinctly
understood that if my little daughter should
die without an heir that my beloved wife
should have the entire disposal of the
Negroes unless I should have any more children
by her & if so then I desire to give each an
equal part of the same.

Lastly I nominate and appoint my friend
John W. Williams Junr to be the executor
of this my last will and Testament to see
the same duly executed according to law
in testimony of which I have unto let my
hand & seal this 21 day of September
1803
