wills heretofore by me made I do leave and bequeath
in the following manner that is to say I give and bequeath
to my son William Jones his life time and his wife Mary
Jones her life time one hundred and twenty two acres of
land wherein he now lives and agreeable to a survey
therof made by Abraham Philips surveyor to enter free
and full possession at my death and at the death of the
said William and Mary Jones his wife I do leave
and bequeath to my grandson William Jones the son
of the aforesaid William and Mary Jones his wife
the before mentioned one hundred and twenty acres
of land I do leave and bequeath to them of daughter
Mary Jones deceased the sum of five shillings and no more
I give and bequeath to the heirs of daughter Sarah Dean
deceased the sum of five shillings and no more
I give and bequeath to my two daughters Margaret, Philip
and Johanna Whelan all my money debts and one
between my household furniture in addition to
what they have already got and received to be
equally divided between them I give and bequeath
to my son John Jones all my crop stock of every
kind together with my wagon and all my plan-
tation tools and apparatus thereto belonging, I do
hereby constitute my son John Jones Executor of
this my last will and Testament revoking
all former wills by me made In witness where-
of I have hereunto set my hand and placed my
seal this the ninth Day of January in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirteen

or value not already bequeathed or divided to

I Daniel Ellington of the County of Rockingham and
State of North Carolina being of sound and disposing
mind and memory do make and ordain this following
as my last will and Testament

First I leave to my dearly beloved wife Sally Ellington
all my land whereon I now live on the East Side of
Town Creek and mill, one negro man named Tom, one
maize Ann two negro women one named Feb the
other Ann, and one negro named Harry two feather
Beds and Furniture, one desk, one large pine table
one large pine chest six chairs, six pewter plates
one pewter dish six knives & forks, 1 pot & one Dutch
oven during her natural life or widowhood, I also
give to my wife Sally one very nice pleasure and one
woman's saddle and bridle two cows and calves
one yoke of Oxen two sows & pigs to her & her heirs for ever
And I give to my son John Ellington two negro men
named Will and Pina, also one cow and calf
one feather Bed and Furniture that he now has
in his possession, I also after my wife's death or wi-
dowhood I give my above mentioned son John one
negro man him & one woman Feb to him and his
heirs for ever

And I leave to my Son Parshal Ellington one hundred
acres of land adjoining the lands of Francis Jackson
and Abraham Philips Esq and one negro woman
named Effie during his life and after his death
I give it to be equally divided amongst the heirs
of his Body lawfully begotten I also give to my
above mentioned son Parshal five shillings in cash
one feather Bed and Furniture one cow and
calf that he now has in his possession to him and
his heirs for ever

And I leave to my son Daniel Ellington my land that is
