I Pleasant Scales of the County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being weak in body but in sound mind and memory blessed be almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say 1st It is my will and desire that after my death that my executor proceed to pay all my just debts out of my estate (decreately) it is my will that the remainder of my estate both real and personal be bequeathed to my beloved wife Charlotte G. Scales during her natural life or widowhood in case of her intermarriage or death it is then my will and desire that my executor take into possession the whole of my estate both real and personal and conduct it in such a way as to render it most advantageous for the benefit and interest of my children until the youngest one becomes of age then I do require my said executor to make an equal division of all my estate both real and personal small and such acquisitions there to be made by my executor in his judicious management of the same between myself and my children equally (divide) It is my will and desire that my executor proceed to give my children an English education as soon as they become of age sufficient to receive the same I authorise my said executor to pay for their tuition out of the proceeds of my estate fourthly it is my will and desire that my worthy friend John Bardwell in whom I place implicit confidence be appointed my lawful executor to transact the business of my whole estate in accordance with all and every law and article of this my last will and testament in testifying whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of August in the year of our Lord 1825 in the presence of William Wall

and as touching such worldly estate as it hath

First I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved
wife Polly Thomas as one half of my estate both
real and personal after my first debts paid and

half of my estate I give and bequeath to my daug-
hter Frances R Thomas after my first debts paid
as above stated also my desire is that my daughter
Frances R Thomas shall have good English school-
ing at the expense of my estate I also appoint my
son George T Thomas with my wife Polly Thomas
my whole executors to this my last will and testament
but reserving all other wills bequeathed or legacies
by me heretofore made in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this

of my son Thomas then I will and bequeath that
all my property shall be equally divided between my
beloved wife Isabella and my dear children Thomas
Ananah, Jessie & Hiram and if in case my wife
should not marry until my son Thomas should
arrive at the age above mentioned my wish is that
this property should be equally divided between
my wife and my dear children the use and bene-
fit of my property to my beloved wife in particular
intended to enable her as much as circumstances
will admit to raise and educate our dear children
and if in case my wife should die either before she
may marry or the arrival of age of my son
Thomas I request that my surviving executor
shall sell my property that shall then remain
in a tract of twelve months and divide the
amount when collected between my dear children
in reserve to my mother in law Elenor Cooke
