Item I commend my soul to God that give it and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner and as to those things that God has in his providence bestowed upon me in this world my wish is that they shall be divided and distributed in the following way and manner. Item my will and desire is that my just and lawful debts be paid. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved and loving wife Nancy my land and house and house hold furniture my stock of horses cattle and hogs standing her meadowhead at the same time she is to be careful to maintain and school my two young sons Lemmy and Isaac and at the death or marriage of my said wife the land to be rented out and the rent money arising therefrom to be put out on interest for the benefit of my two sons Lemmy and Isaac until they arrive to the age of twenty one years and then I give and bequeath my lands above said to my two sons Lemmy and Isaac to them their heirs and assigns forever to be equally divided between them and the movable property before mentioned I do give and bequeath to my wife Nancy for her only and to her heirs forever. Item I have always given to my son John all I intended to give him before he left this country.

Item 4th I have always given to my son Daniel all that I ever intended to give him before he left this country and as my son Daniel Wafford on account of my being his security made to me a bill of sale for a certain negro boy named Jack about eight years old receivable in two years from the date of the bill of sale now provided that Daniel Wafford should and resiturns all such money to my estate as I may have paid on account of my being his security and also all such for the sums as my executors may hereafter have to pay on that account within three years after my decease my will is that Daniel should get the negroes again but provided he fails to pay all such money as provided with the lawful interest thereon then the said negro is to belong to my estate and to be kept by my wife to work the better to maintain her to maintain my two children and at her death or marriage to be hired out to work for the use of my two sons until they arrive at twenty one years of age and then I give and bequeath the said negro boy to my two sons Lemmy and Isaac to them their heirs and assigns forever they may sell and divide the price or settle it between them with the advice of my executors what ever may then seem best. Item 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy one cow and a calf or the value thereof in a action of what I have given her heretofore. Item 6th I give and bequeath to my son Jesse the sum of five shillings current money in a action to what I have formerly given. Item 7th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Hamilton the sum of five shillings current money in a action to what I have formerly given her.
