That the remainder of my negroes (to witt) Clog George Sam Green Betty Clog & Toney & their increase if any to be equally divided Between William Walker & Abner Walker, John Walker, Susannah Fore Betty Morgan, Maggy Webster & my Seals & Pacy Jones to them & their heirs forever, also all my stock of every kind with all my household goods of every kind & all my tools for plantation use & every other article not mentioned to be equally divided amongst the above mentioned William Walker John Walker Abner Walker Susannah Fore Betsy Morgan Maggy Webster & my Seals and Pacy Jones to them & their heirs forever - and all accounts with my children prior to this is settled also it is my will and appointment that my son Abner Walker & Peter Seals to be my executors of this my last will & testament, in witness whereof I the said James Walker to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

My will and desire is that my whole property be given up to my loving wife Fanny Whitsett untill her death or marriage and then to be equally divided between my sons Samuel Whitsett & John Whitsett and that they live with her on my plantation untill her death or marriage and my desire is that they should continue to live together and to have schooling sufficient for common business and I do hereby appoint my loving wife Fanny Whitsett my sole executrix of this my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me heretofore made given under my hand and seal this third day of April in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and six.
