Item I Give and bequeath to my son James the half of the Tract of land where I live, and the the land on Rock House. I leave one half to James and James is to pay seventy five dollars to my three Daughters.

Item I give to my son William one half of the land where I live to when and the half of the land on Rock House to him he is to pay seventy five dollars to my three daughters. —

The tract of land joining Joseph Gaung to be sold and the money to be divided between my Daughter Betsy, Anna, & Peggy equally.

It is my desire that all my property to be sold and and equally divided between my wife James, William, Betsy Anna & Peggy; the money and notes and accts. is to be equally divided Between my Wife & five Children.

I appoint James Wardlow & David Heron my lawful executors. To this my will & Testament. Signed seal and delivered in the presence of us in the year of our Lord 1808 (March 14th) from County of Rockingham Patrick Wardlow

thanks be to God for it, knowing that I and
all men were born to die.

I do make & declare this my last will &
Testament, disposing of my worldly

Estate, after a decent burial and my Just debts
paid in the following manner, viz.
First I bequeath to my oldest son George Dilworth
the sum of Ten shillings currency of said state
and County.

Secondly I bequeath to my son Thomas Dilworth
the next oldest one half of the Tract of land
that I now live on & his half To be where he
now lives, the other half of the land where I
now live to my Youngest son John Dilworth
to be equally divided between them Further for
this consideration to take care & sufficiently
in all respects whatsoever, maintain my Afflic-
ed son Benjamin Dilworth equally between
them & moreover for the better Enabling the
two sons Thomas & John Dilworth to maintain
sufficiently their Brother Benjamin Dilworth.

3. I give & bequeath Each of them one negro man
apiece To wit to my son Thomas Dilworth
and Gile the other negro to my son John
Dilworth - also to the above John my son I
bequeath one bedstead & furniture, also to my
son Benjamin Dilworth one bed and furni-
ture.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my above named sons
Thomas and John Dilworth my still & every thing
there to belonging. and my waggon to be equally
divided between them.

Fifthly To my Daughter Mary Dilworth I give and
