I, Isaac Lowe of the County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina, being weak of body but of sound and perfect memory, do make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament. In the form and manner following, wiz:

To My beloved wife, Catherine Lowe, I will and bequeath all my personal estate together with my land and negroes during her natural life and then to be disposed of in the following manner which I will be hereafter mentioned.

Item 1, To my son, Thomas Lowe I will and bequeath the tract of land I now live on at my said wife's death, to him and his heirs forever, like wise two beds which is now in his possession, I also bequeath to him and his heirs etc.

Item 2, To my daughter, Margaret Moore, I give and bequeath one bed and furniture, also one bed and furniture in the manner above mentioned.

Item 3, to my daughter, Fanny Pearson, I give and bequeath at my wife's death as much property as she may make choice of as will be of value to her good and furniture.

Item 4, To my son-in-law, Samuel Moore and my daughter-in-law, Mary Lowe I give and bequeath to each five shillings, I bequeath my wearing apparel and saddle to my said son Thomas Lowe.

And all the remainder of my personal estate at my wife's death I bequeath to my four children, to wit:

Thomas Love, Margaret Moore, Frankey Edmunson, and Fanny Pearson

And as to my said negroes which I am now possessed of, it is my will and desire at my said wife's death for the true and faithful services which they have performed to me I do hereby absolutely ordain that they be set free, all that I am possessed of or that I may hereafter be possessed with: One negro woman named Nell, the wife of a certain free man name Charles Friend, two negroe men, one name Jack and the other Charles, four negro girls and women, Beach, Mary, Bett, Alley and Fan also one negro boy named James, likewise two children of the above mentioned Beck Hannah and Friend, I do by virtue of this my last will and testament ordain that they be free men and women as above mentioned.

I do likewise constitute and appoint Andrew Boyd my whole and State Executor, revoking and denulling all wills heretofore made by me, in witness of which I have set my hand, this 14th day of February 1806, signed sealed published and pronounced in presence of
