Mary Patrick

In the name of God Amen I Mary Patrick
do constitute and appoint this to be my last
will and testament in the following words

I give to my son Hugh Patrick a clear title to
the land that he now lives on from any person
claiming by or under me

I give to my son ~~Hugh~~ ^{James} Patrick a clear title
to the land that he now lives on from any
person claiming by or under me together with
100 dollars in money.

I give to my daughter Elantra Young 100
dollars in money. I also will that negro
Betty continue in the service of Elantra
Young her natural lifetime then to be the
equal property of her daughters by said
Jacob Young both said Betty and her offspring

I give to my son Ebenezer Patrick the land
that he now lives on including the improve-
ments made by himself that is to say all
the land lying on the South side of Haw-
River belonging to the tract that I now
live on.

I give to my Grandson James Patrick

son of Wm. Patrick the land that I now
live on lying on the north side of Haw: river
and I will that my plantation be rented for
the common benefit of my sons and daughters
until him the said James son of William
comes to the age of twenty one years; and
provided that he the said James should die
before he arrives to the age of twenty one
years, then, in that case the land devised to
him to be the equal property of my three
sons Hugh, James and Ebenezer.

I will that Polly Patrick widow of William
Patrick remain in possession of the improve-
ments made by William Patrick while
she remains the widow of William Patrick
deceased and then afterwards that it be
rented for the benefit of her son James
Patrick till he comes of age.

I give to my daughter and her ~~husband~~
John Odinal the tract of land that they
live on containing 226 acres as by Deed
from Peter Oliver will appear.

I give to my daughter Elatilda and her
husband Newton Wright the land that they
now live on containing 200 acres as by deed
from Isaac Philips will appear provided
always that he said Wright shall pay to
my Grandson James M. Sparran the sum of
two hundred Dollars when he arrives to the
age of twenty one years, and in case that he
said M. Sparran should die before he arrives
to twenty one then the above mentioned 200
Dollars to be the equal property of the heirs
of Elatilda Wright.

I give my Granddaughters Betsy daughter
of Hugh and Polly daughter of James and
Mary daughter of Elantra Young and Elantra
daughter of Elatilda Wright the sum of
one hundred dollars each.

I give to my Grandson James M. Sparran
300 dollars to be paid to him at the age of
twenty one, and if he should die before he
arrives to the age of twenty one years then
the above mentioned three hundred dollars
to be the equal property of my own sons
and daughters.

I give to my Grandson William Young my

tract of land on Big Troublesome Creek as by
deed from John Sproull will appear.
Give to my nephew William son of William
Buchanan dec'd the sum of 50 dollars to be paid
to be paid to him when he arrives to the age of
twenty one years
Give John M. Sparrano the sum of five dollars
to be paid him out of my estate
Will that by beds and furniture and table
linen and wearing apparel be equally divided
among my three daughters
Will that my negro girl Philis have liberty
to make choice of a master among my sons
and sons-in-law that be.
Will that my property exclusive of what
is given by Will be put to sale & credit
by way of venture and whereas the money
arising from such sale with other debts
due me can be collected, and the men-
tioned legacies made up, that then the
balance of my estate be equally divided
between my sons and daughters.
Appoint my son James Patrick and my
son-in-law John Colman to execute this
my last Will and Testament. To all which
presents I have set my hand and seal
this 12th day of March in the year of our
Lord Eighteen and four
