That I constitute Joseph Gentry & Thomas Peier Executors of this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this 6th Day of July one thousand eight hundred and eleven

That To my dear beloved son John Roberts I give and bequeath one new feather Bed and furniture and bedside, one chest, one small trunk, and all my wearing apparel to him, his heirs & assigns for ever

That To my Niece Lucinda Roberts Daughter of my Sister Elizabeth Roberts, her heirs and assigns for ever, I give and bequeath ten Dollars in money, provided, that the same can be safely conveyed and applied to her particular use and I hereby strictly require it on my Executor herein after named to the claim of my Will shall be executed with fidelity provided nevertheless that in case my said Executor shall not have it in his power to convey the said legacy of ten Dollars to the said Lucinda so that it shall be applied to her particular use and benefit prior to my said son John's becoming of lawful age that then and in that case it shall go to my said son John his heirs and assigns for ever

That Immediately after my decease my will and desire is that the whole of the balance of my Estate consisting of Cattle, household and kitchen furniture &c. shall be sold by my said Executor to the highest bidder at public auction on twelve months credit and the moneys arising from such sale or sales

together with all my outlandish debts when
 deceased and all moneys that may be on hand
 if any I also give and bequeath to my said son
 John Roberts his heirs and assigns for ever
 Lastly I constitute and appoint my nephew Ellis
 Roberts of the aforesaid State and County Executor
 of this my last will and testament with a request
 that he my said Executor will see that the bus-
 iness herein before bequeathed to my son John Ro-
 bots when collected shall be put to legal business
 for the use and benefit of my said son John until
