## Peter Hardon

In the name of God Amen

I Peter Hardon of the County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory (I hope to god) do this 27<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred and nineteen make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say

First, I give and bequeath to my Sister Peggy Hardon two negroes of her own choice out of all my negroes I know possibl. also I give and bequeath to my Sister Peggy Hardon all my land and tenements both in the Counties of Rockingham and Paswell of North Carolina (Excepting the tract called and known by the name of the Cobb's tract of land and one other called and known by the name of Moon Creek tract of land — Also I give and bequeath to my Sister Peggy Hardon all my house hold and kitchen furniture and all my plantations tools of every description and all my stock of horses Excepting the Constitution Bell and all my stock of cow cattle hogs sheep and any blacksmith tools and my two waggon and all the harness

or gear belonging to them and my two stills and all the mobby blands stock tools and light cash to be my said Sister Peggy Hardon and her heirs forever — and also I give and bequeath to my Sister Peggy Hardon all my crop of every description and stock of every kind provision of every kind for ever I give and bequeath to my nephew Thompson Hardon two negroes of the next choice after my Sister Peggy Hardon has taken her choice also I give and bequeath to my nephew Thompson Hardon one half of my moon creek tract of land to be laid off to him from the upper line of said tract adjoining William Paschal, also one half of my Cobb tract of land dividing said tract equally by a north and south line and also my constitution Cobb. & my watch to him the said Thompson Hardon & his heirs for ever, I give and bequeath to my nephew John Hardon the other half of my moon creek tract of land and the other half of the Cobb tract of land, & also one Negro girl called & known by the name of Linda to him the said John Hardon & his heirs for ever, it is my will and desire that the grave yard, where my Father's grave & Mother is buried shall be enclosed within a stone wall four feet high eighteen inches thick (the wall) and fifty feet long & twenty five wide in the clear, in which enclosure I wish to be buried myself & other relatives, the building of which wall to be paid out of a part of my land or cash on hand It is my will & desire that the balance of my lots of land and open account, & money on hand, after paying for the building the above wall or enclosure, together with the balance of my negro property shall be equally divided among all my nephews and nieces, Thompson Hardon & John Hardon Executed

to make this my last will statement  
Imprimis I order and direct all my just debts be paid and  
my funeral expence which I wish to be plain and decent  
out of my Estate, I have lately given some of my prop-  
erty away to my children, that is to say, to my daughter  
Mary Dearing one nego girl named Jinny daughter  
of old Jane, ~~to my son Robert Hunter~~ and to my  
daughter Rachel Dalton one nego girl named Grace  
both daughters of old Grace, To my son Samuel Hunter  
one nego woman named Amy and four of her  
children, Mulkey, Caroline Frank and the Young  
lucking child three hundred fifty of the proffit of  
Amy and her children I give to my grand children  
James & Robert Hunter sons of and heirs of my son Dr.  
Robert Hunter and the said three hundred fifty dollars is in  
the hand of their Guardian ~~as~~ Samuel Hunter for their use  
to help their schooling - also I give to my two grand  
sons James A Dearing and Samuel Dalton a land warrant  
for 1000 acres of land in the hands of Pleasant Henderson  
or Boling Fisher in the state of Tennessee to be equally divided  
between them also I give a nego boy named Shy here  
to my grandson James Hunter son of Samuel Hunter  
all above given is to them and their heirs forever and  
all account and claims of every description prior to this  
date with my children & legatees is fully settled up to 1817  
all the residue of my estate not above disposed of or given  
away to my legatees that god has helped me with that  
is to say all my lands one tract with their improvements  
where I live containing one thousand acres one tract on  
Clio River in the state of Tennessee held by a deed
