 my estate if any to be divided between my children
 as above stated my will is that my Executor & Executor
 shall all my children alike and further request them
 to be active in settling my estate and make no inquiries
 of any part of what may be sold and as the title
 for the interest of the same my further will is that
 at the death of my wife or when my Executor or Executor
 shall think it can be, shared pay to my son Preston
 & Hodges or his lawful heirs the sum of two hundred
 & ~~thirty~~ thousand Dollars which all my children are
 to pay their equal part of the same at the death of my
 or if ~~the~~ should marry them I request that my children
 should receive such part of my estate as can be left hand

I now hereby bring this my will to a close recom-
 mending my soul to God the Father and my mortal
 parts to the ground from whence it came having full
 confidence in the Resurrection of the world In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 39th day of March 1819.

 hence this is to be as fully
 binding ~~as if~~ as if this was
 as many as would set their hands
 to this paper as my hand writing
 is fully known.

In the name of ~~the~~ ^{God} Amen.
 I Richard Henderson of the County of Rockingham
 and State of North Carolina being very sick & weak but
 of sound & perfect mind memory blessed be God do this
 first day of April in the year of our Lord 1819 one thou-
 sand eight hundred & fourteen make & declare this my
 last will & testament in the manner and form follow-
 ing (Ver) that is to say first I give to my well beloved
 son John Henderson a certain part or parcel of land
 off of my old tract, beginning at a hickory tree in
 George Ammons line thence north to a black oak sapling
 thence east to a post oak thence north to a black oak
 thence east to a black gum in Richard Henderson's line
 it running with the branch to John Murray's line contain-
 ing all the southeastern corner of my old tract of land
 Secondly I give to my well beloved son Richard Hen-
 derson two hundred acres or more by Charles Phillips
 Thirdly, I give to my well beloved son William Hender-
 son all the balance of my old tract of land supposed
 to contain three hundred & sixty four acres, Fourthly
 I leave all the balance of my estate to be sold on a
 credit of twelve months and after paying my beloved
 Daughter Mary Henderson the sum of six dollars the
 balance be equally divided between my well beloved wife
 Elizabeth Henderson & my seven other children namely
 Sarah Hollinger Thomas Henderson Joseph Henderson
 Samuel Henderson Mary Henderson Genet Moore &
 Elizabeth Henderson, And I hereby make & declare my worth-
 y friends Henry Moore & William Henderson Executors
 of this my last will and testament in witness
 whereof I the said Richard Henderson, do have to this
 my last will & testament set my hand & seal

 North Carolina being of Sound Mind and Memory have
 thought proper to make this my last will and testament
 in the first place I will that my Just debts be paid out
 of my estate after which my will is that my wife Mary
 King receive out of the value of my Land which I think
 is worth \$426 to her the sum of Eighty and a dollar and
 Sixty Cents which amounts to two thirds of the value of my
 Land & property then I say she shall have her choice of my
 horse and her choice of my cows furthermore she shall
 have her bed her table and ten dollar worth of as she may
 chose out of my kitchen furniture after the debts and the
 aforesaid distribution is taken out my will is that my
 son Henry retain out of all the balance of my Land &
 Estate and third then the balance to be equally divided between
 among all my children Henry excepted this being my
 last will and testament and I hereby appoint Henry King
 my son & my Brother Henry King as Executor of this my
 last will and testament in witness my hand and seal
 on the 30th day of December 1819. } Thomas King Seal
