In the name of God amen I Robert Martin of the
County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina
being of sound mind and perfect memory blessed be God
for his mercies do this twelfth day of August in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen
make and publish this my last will and testament in
manner following that is to say. I desire my body to be
secretly interred in the family Vault should I survive
in the County aforesaid and commend to almighty
God my soul who gave it me and am in hopes that
both soul and body will be united again at the great
day of Judgment and that they will be wafted up to
Heavenly mansions thereto join the holy choir of
Angels and Archangels and the spirits of just men
made perfect in singing praises to the almighty
Jehovah. Inprimis it is my will and desire that my
property be disposed of in the following manner after
what few debts I owe be discharged.

I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha
Martin the use of the plantation whereon I now
live and stock of all kind and household furniture
during her natural life and have her support
from the said plantation and the following negro
Viz Lucy and her children Ambrose and Ann
and her future increase to dispose of them as she
may think proper and likewise the use of the neg-
ro girl named Peggy during her natural life
I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Sally
Martin the following negroes Viz Mary her chil-
dren Lucy and Lopsy and their future increase
to her and her heirs forever and likewise

244 a negro woman by the name of Malina and her two children Sally and Parker and their future increase to her and her heirs forever provided the said Sally Napier and her brother Robert Martin does not buy or exchange for a negro man according to her choice of said Robert Martin for the said Malina and her children

Now I give and bequeath to my son Robert Martin the tract of Land whereon I now live together with all the appurtenances thereto belonging Mill & and the following negroes namely Billy Ann Solomon his wife Rachel and her children At and Peggy after his Mother's decease Peter and Camond Daniel Ezra and Solomon and all their future increase to him and his heirs forever.

Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Rachel Broach the negro Lea and her daughter Caroline and all their future increase for her support during her natural life and then to descend to the heirs of her body to be equally divided among them.

Now I give and bequeath to my son John Martin the negro man named Sam to him and his heirs forever and Lastly I appoint my son Robert Martin and John Martin Executors to this my last will and testament In testimony whereof I the said Robert Martin here to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written Signed sealed and declared by the said Robert Martin the testator as his last will and testament
