I give and bequeath unto my son  
William all that tract or parcel of land  
lying on Sandy River beginning at Thomas  
Hight's corner on a state or thence following  
the said line to the road thence down to a  
new line made between lot Wilson and  
my self thence along the new line to the river  
Chestnut and bequeath all my stock and  
household furniture to my beloved wife for  
the use of her and the family I give my  
executors or trustees <sup>to</sup> R. Richardson and George Bates  
Thos. Green <sup>Mary Bates</sup> and sealed this 24th day  
of October 1808.

## JOHN COVINGTON

In the name of God Amen. I John  
Covington of Rockingham County State  
of North Carolina being in a weak and  
debilitated state of body, but of sound mind  
and memory and having to mind that it  
is appointed for man once to die, do make and  
execute this my last will and testament.

First it is my will and desire that my beloved  
wife Mary Covington shall have the free use of  
and benefit of my house plantation together  
with the stock and all my movable estate of  
every kind and description for and during her  
natural life, provided she remains my widow  
but in case of her intermarriage it is my will  
that she have a <sup>modest</sup> part.

It is also my will that if in the opinion  
of my executors the stock should so increase  
as to become two large or any part of the  
property should become in a state of waste  
or loss that my executors shall see and  
dispose of such part as to them shall  
appear for the benefit of the estates  
It is expressly intended that the whole tract  
of land wherein I now reside agreeable to  
its known boundaries in manner by the express  
intention of my wife plantation above and it also  
be included in the property intended to left  
to my wife during her life or widowhood  
I give and bequeath to my son William  
Covington all my lands on the following  
conditions and the circumstances  
hereafter mentioned that is shall be shown  
be entitled to immediate possession of  
my house and plantation of Covington  
together with an acre adjoining except a lot  
to be laid off at the discretion of my  
executors for the benefit of my son John  
Covington as here after mentioned it is  
also my will that my said son William  
Covington shall have and enjoy all  
my other lands at the death of his mother  
and his paying his brother Thomas Covington  
five hundred dollars and the further sum  
of three hundred dollars to my grand  
son Edmund Covington to be paid  
so soon as the said Edmund shall  
arrive at the age of twenty one years  
the lot designed for the benefit of <sup>the</sup> my son John Covington  
to revert to my son William at the death  
of my son John

~~John Bunnigan~~ <sup>late</sup>  
and I do hereby constitute and appoint my  
friend Edward Peoples and my son William  
Bunnigan to be full and sole Executors and  
no other of this my last will and testament  
and I do hereby revoke disannul and make  
void all former wills and testaments hereto  
fore by me made in witness whereof  
I the said John Bunnigan to witness  
my last will and testament do set my  
hand and seal this twenty sixth day of  
January one thousand eight hundred and one  
Year Edward R Peoples <sup>his</sup> John Bunnigan

sign or where we once lye may rest.  
Item B give to my son Samuel twenty five  
acres of land of that tract it being the place  
generally known the mill seat it being so  
said of that it will furnish a pond and timber  
to build the mill. Item C give and bequeath  
unto my beloved wife and see husband all the  
tract or parcel of land lying joining  
Slabbedale line and exceeding my quantity  
full four hundred and thirteen acres. My big  
childer is not to be excluded from any thing  
that was ever their privilage.  
Item D give and bequeath to my six daughters  
of my first wife my six negroes Ben Cady  
Frobisher Dutch and many the said negroes to  
remain with my wife till my daughter  
mecca becomes of age and if those negroes  
in that time should run away the same  
be given to my daughter polly if not  
a good peather bed and furnishe
