In the name of God amen I Walter Martin being weak in body but sound in my senses and memory and calling to mind that it is appointed once for all men to die as make this my last will and testament first I recommend my soul to God and my body to the grave to be buried in a christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my executors as for my worldly goods that it has pleased God to bless me with it is my desire that they be disposed of in the following manner.

I give to my beloved wife the plantation where our now live during the time she remains my widow I give to her the choice of all my horse creatures her bed and furniture one cow also the one half of all my kitchen furniture to her and her heirs forever. I give to my son Ananias ten dollars together with all he has received from me I give to my daughter Agnes ten dollars in full with all she hath received. I give to my two daughters Mary and Esther the remaining part of my kitchen furniture to be equally divided after wards ten dollars to Mary to receive one cow it being known and given to her one bed and furniture one saddle and ~~top~~ ^{top} ~~collar~~ ^{collar}. It being in full with all they have received I give to my three sons Robert William & Abraham all my land as to be equally divided after William arrives to the age of twenty one years so that he it remembered the profit of the Land to still remain with my wife and her small children as in the first clause mentioned I wish my executors to collect all my debts and pay all my last debts and the remaining part to be equally divided between my wife and my three daughters.

amongst Isabel Ellinor and Rachel lastly I appoint my wife my son Ananias and William Executors of this my last will and testament in witness where of I as hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this 31st day of August in the year of our Lord 1817

In the name of God amen I Samuel Moore of the State of North Carolina and county of Rockingham being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God now calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that the time will come for all mankind to die as recommend my soul to the God who gave it and my body to the discretion of my executors to be buried in a decent like christian manner and touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life as this the 13th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty five make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say.

First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Moore my Land her Life time or widowhood and my Dore man and side saddle one cow and bed and furniture the cupboard and furniture the clock and one loom and all my house hold and kitchen

named are taken away this property all except the
Land to be equally divided between my three Daughters
Elizabeth Sarah & Rachel at the death or marriage
of my wife the sheep and Geese with the wool cotton
flax &c. to be left at her discretion

2nd I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth
Samannah the carriage which she has at present
and one cow.

3rd I do give and bequeath unto my son Enoch Moore
a piece of Land including his mill &c. which is
more particularly described in another piece of writing
signed by me &c. I do give and bequeath to son John
Moore one dollar. 5th I do give and bequeath unto
my son Pearson Moore one horse and saddle one cow
one bea and furniture. 6th I do give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Sarah Moore one horse and saddle
two cows and calves two beas and furniture ~~one~~^{two}
beas one folding Table ^{flax} one poplar chest
six chairs and one loom one pot and one oven

I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Rachel
Moore one horse and saddle two cows and calves two
beas and furniture one beason one folding Table
one standing Table one poplar chest six chairs and
one loom one pot one oven my plantation waggon
and five more to be sold and equally divided between
my three daughters Elizabeth Sarah and Rachel

8 I do give and bequeath unto my two youngest sons
Samuel Moore and William Moore my Land to
be equally divided between them at the death or
marriage of my wife each of them to have a horse
and saddle each one bea and furniture the road
wagon ~~lan~~ hogheads barrels and all farming tools

Took all my canonical tools all the hog all the ~~248~~
balance of cattle that is not above ~~all~~
waggon and hough Geese with all the rest of my
property yet unnamed which shall be equally divided
between my two above named sons Samuel & William
after all my funeral and other debts are paid and I
hereby make and ordain my son Enoch Moore
Executor of this my Last will and testament in
witness whereof I the said Samuel Moore have to
this my last will and testament set my hand and
seal the day and year above written signed sealed
published and declared by the said Samuel Moore
to be his last will and testament in the presence of
us who were present at the signing and sealing
thereof
