In the name of god amende the seventeenth day of March in the year of our lord Eighteen hundred and thirteen I Sam'l Woodward of the County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina being weak in Body but in good and perfect mind and memory thanks be to almighty god belonging to my untried Estate of this County I do make constate and ordain all flesh must yield unto death where it shall please god to call do make constate or ordain and declare this my last will and testament

my will is that all my just debts first to be paid by my executors hereafter to be mentioned here I give to my dear and beloved wife Letitia Woodward during her life the balances of my negro boy Peter John & Fanny after my debts are paid with my stock of Hogs cattle and horses household and kitchen furniture and all my working tools Item my will is that after the death of my beloved wife that the balance of the said negro with the stock of Hogs cattle and horses and household furniture and kitchen furniture and working tools to be set up at the highest bidder and sold at auction credit and the money to be divided in threeparts Item my will is that my son Edmund Woodward receive two parts of the money and my son Edward receive one part out of three of the money I also ordain and appoint my worthy friends Ira Ellis and Sterling Haffen my executors to this my last will & testament sealed signed and acknowledged in the presence of us Richard Stubblefield Robert Stubblefield Samuel Woodward C.C.
