In the name of God amen I William Feather of the County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina being in a very low state of health but of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament revoking all other Wills ever made by me in the first place my will is that all my last debts be paid and the balance and the balance of my property both real and personal be disposed of as follows to wit my will is that the land whereon I now live containing nineteen acres and one hundred and ten poles bounded by William Bethells land Alfred M Bethells & the Land formerly belonged to Hugh Mills to be sold on a credit of one year the purchaser giving bond and good security and the money arising from the sale of said Land to be put out on interest and be received every year and kept on interest until the youngest child becomes of age and then to be divided among my six youngest children to wit Martha Feather John Feather George Feather Martha Feather Frances Feather & Lucenia Feather as to other property I wish sold in the same way and a credit of one year given and the money put out on interest and remain so until the children all become of age that is my six youngest children as named above one cow and calf one pair cart wheels one shot Gun one horn ratt one Dutch oven one sow and six shotes two beds as to the other bed it belongs to Martha which was given to her by her aunt Sally and baby Lamberts and should any of my children die before they become of age the balance to be divided amongst the other children that is living that is the children I have

By my last wife Frances Lambert I give to my Daughter Rachael Dapson five cents I give to my son William Feather 5 cents only I give to my Daughter Sally Decher five cents only I give to my Daughter Mary Davis five cents only Peggy Stanley I give five cents only I give to Betsey Wood five cents only I give to my son Thomas Feather five cents only I give to my Daughter Mary Fisher five cents only I appoint Thomas Feather my executor to this my last will and testament and requesting him to take charge of all my children and carry them to his own house and keep them as they were his own for my sake I further wish my son Thomas after he has been qualified to sell all the property real and personal in the name that I have named in the will and take the notes payable to him the said Thomas ~~Feather~~ Feather as executor and collect the money as soon as it becomes due and take it with him to his country and loan it out where he can see to it near home upon the terms named in this will my will and desire is that Thomas Feather do unto act on the will until he gets Paul William Bethells advice how he ought to proceed as intrup my hand and seal this 11th day of July 1826 in presence of.
