of the County of Rockingham and State of North Carolina
being sound in mind and health do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament disavowing all other
wills heretofore by me made I do leave and bequeath
in the following manner that is to say I give and bequeath
to my son William Womles his life time and his wife Mary
Womles her life time one hundred and twenty two acres of
land wherein he now lives and agreeable to a survey
therof made by Abraham Philips surveyor to enter free
and full possession at my death and at the death of the
said William and Mary Womles his wife I do leave
and bequeath to my grandson William Womles the son
of the aforesaid William and Mary Womles his wife
the before mentioned one hundred and twenty two acres
of land I do leave and bequeath to them of daughters
Mary Womles decedent the sum of five shillings and no more
I give and bequeath to the heirs of daughter Sarah Dean
decedent the sum of five shillings and no more
I give and bequeath to my two daughters Margaret, Philip
and Johanna Whitten all my money debts and one
hundred my household furniture in addition to
what they have already got and received to be
equally divided between them I give and bequeath
to my son John Womles all my crop stock of every
kind together with my wagon and all my plan-
tation tools and apparatus thereto belonging, I do
hereby constitute my son John Womles Executor of
this my last will and Testament revoking
all former wills by me made In witness where-
of I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
seal this the ninth day of January in the
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirteen

I will my negro boy Sampson to my sister
Polly Bateman but the said negro to remain at &
in possession of Nancy Little wife of my said Father
there upon to work for the support of my two young-
est sisters & children of said Nancy and after
the expiration of 3 years to be the said property of
my sister Polly & her heirs forever
I give and bequeath all the money left me
by my Father with to the said two youngest
children of my Father to wit Nancy & Sarah
I will that all my property of any kind
or value not already bequeathed or divided to
