I now give and bequeath to my daughter Rachael  
Broach the negro Lea and her Daughter Caroline  
and all their future increase for her support  
during her natural life and then to ascend to  
the heirs of her body to be equally divided among

them. I now give and bequeath to my son Robert Martin  
the negro man named Sam to him and his heirs  
forever and lastly I appoint my son Robert Martin  
and John Martin executors to this my last will  
and testament in testimony whereof I the said  
Robert Martin do here to this my last will  
and testament set my hand and seal the day and  
year above written signed sealed and declared

I give and bequeath to my grand son William Scott  
all the land I now lie on supposed to be eighty acre  
Also I give to my daughter Nancy Martin forty dollars in  
cash to be paid out of the price of a negro hereafter men-

tioned I give to my two daughters Nancy Martin and Mar-  
gant Lemons all of my house hold and kitchen furniture  
except one bed and furniture and one desk to be equally  
divided between them as they think proper

I give to my daughter Margant Lemons thirty  
dollars to be paid out of the price of a negro hereafter  
mentioned

I give to my grand son William Scott one bed  
and furniture

I give to my son John Martin and my daughter  
Martha Atkins a negro woman named Judith and my  
will and desire is that she should be treated well as she  
hath been a good slave to me

244 Here I give to my two daughters Martha Atkins and  
Esther Lemons ten dollars each to be paid out of the price  
of a negro woman named Hannah which I desire should  
be sold to the highest bidder and also my Desk and cup  
board also my horse and farming tools my hogs and sheep  
and all my cattle except one cow  
Item my will and desire is that after the money of  
sale of the above mentioned articles is collected and all  
my just debts is paid and legacies above mentioned that  
the balance remaining should be at the disposal of my  
executors on interest for the benefit of my son Andrew  
Heirs until they come of age and then to be equally  
divided between them all

Item I give to my negro woman named Hannah one cow  
Lastly I appoint John Read and Thomas Hopkins  
executors of this my last will and testament hereby  
revoking all others heretofore made in witness where  
of I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal  
this the third day of December one thousand eight  
hundred and thirteen
