Carolina being very weak in body but of sound mind & memory & calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will & test: that is to say principally I recommend my soul to God who gave it me & my body to the earth to be buried in a decent christian burial at the discretion of my executors & as touching my worldly estate I give & dispose of them in manner as followeth First I give to my wife Catharina my four head of cattle which my son Henry is to feed, likewise the upper part of the meadow also my house & all the furniture & a note of fifty pounds, which my son Henry is to pay to me also what money I have in hand to the proper use & behoof of my beloved wife Catharina & to each of my other heirs, I give each & every of them one english shilling to be paid to them after my

death & I do constitute & appoint my son Peter Cruse & my wife Catharina executors of this my last will & test: & do hereby make void all other wills made by me heretofore Ratifying & declaring this & no other to be my last will & test: in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 3rd day of May 1804.

In the name of God Amen! I Adam Coble of Rowan County & State of N.C. Carolina (Planter) being in perfect health & of good & sound memory, thanks be to God for the same, & now calling unto mind the mortality of my body, & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die: do this 28th day of November A.D.: 1794 make & ordain this my last will & test: I give & recommend my soul to God, who gave it, & my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner and as touching all worldly estate, wherewith it had pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise & dispose of the same in the manner as followeth

First I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth, one horse creature her choice & two cows her choice her bed & spinning wheel, & give unto her my copper Still during the whole time she will remain a widow, & desire she shall keep her possession on the plantation I now live on during the whole time she remains a widow but if she marries I desire she shall have but a child's part, of all my personal property

Secondly I give & bequeath to my well beloved son Peter, my plantation to be with two hundred pounds I desire my son Peter shall pay unto the rest of my children, after his mother's death one hundred & fifty pounds, every year fifteen pounds untill the hundred & fifty pounds is paid.

Unto my son Jacob I have already given fifty pounds as his part.

4. I give & bequeath unto my son Adam the sum of fifty pounds as the money now possess, ten shilling to the hard dollar.

5. I give & bequeath unto each of my daughters Ee Mesomeng children the sum of twenty five pounds.

6. I give & bequeath unto each of my daughters the sum of twenty five pounds good & lawful money.

7. I give unto John Mesomes five shillings.

If there remains any balance I desire it shall be equal divided amongst my children, & do hereby constitute & appoint my two worthy friends Peter Cable junr & Jacob Fisher, executors of this my last will & test. in testimony whereof I the said Adam Cable have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written.

In the name of God Amen! I Joseph Cunningham of the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina being of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed be God, do this 29th day of January A.D. 1801. make & publish this my last will & test. in manner following, (that is to say)

1. That my body be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executors.

2. That all my just debts be paid out of my estate.

3. I will & bequeath unto my beloved wife Henry Cunningham the plantation whereon I now live during her natural life time, & two cows to be at her choice & one bed & bedding & as much of the household furniture as will be necessary to keep house with it.

4. I will & bequeath unto my sons Wm^r & John Cunningham all my part of the iron works lying in the state of Seneca & Carter County & the land thereto to be equally divided between them.

5. I will & bequeath unto my daughters Elizabeth Dial & Martha Davis the land whereon the said Dial now lives to be divided agreeable to the deed that I have heretofore made to them.

6. I will & bequeath unto my son Joseph Cunningham the land he now lives on the branch running between his field mine is to be the dividing line.

7. I will & bequeath unto my sons Robert & George Cunningham the two tracts of land lying on the waters of Clinch river in the State of Seneca to be equally divided between them.
