comes of age five shillings.

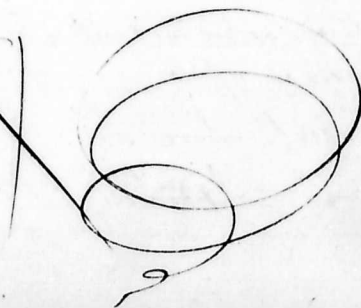
I will & bequeath to my loving wife Catharine Danner all
the residue of my estate, goods & cattle, land & tenements
with all the advantages arising therefrom, during her life
& her children in consequence, she should marry hereafter &
have any & hereby constitute & ordain my worthy friend John
Euler Esq. with my wife executor of this my last will & test.

last will & test set my hand & seal the day & year above written,
Signed, sealed & published

& delivered by the said Jacob Danner,
the Testator as his last will & test: *mark.*

In the name of God Amen! I Alexander Dobbins
son: of the County of Rowan & State of N. Carolina being
of perfect mind & judgment, & calling to mind the mortality
of the body & that it is appointed for all men once to die,
being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, in as just one
equal a manner as possibly before my decease, do make
this my last will & test: in the following form. Principally
& first of all I resign my soul to God who gave it & my
body to the earth to be buried in a decent & christian manner
at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned not
doubting but at the great day of judgment I shall receive
the same from almighty God & to worldly property as
it had pleased God to bless me with. I give & bequeath
in following manner. (viz.)

I give & bequeath to Jean Dobbins my loving wife all
the sum of money coming to her as my wife, from the
executors of Samuel Templeson deceased as by his will
fully appears, also her saddle, bed & bed cloaths my pew-
ter my iron pots, the use of my Negro woman Dinah
as long as my wife lives, & her maintenance of the plantation.
I now live on during life & a child part of the residue of
my estate hereafter mentioned & after the death of my
wife Jean I desire Dinah to be sold with all her increase
after my decease & to be equally divided amongst my
children. I also bequeath to my wife Jean one horse one
cow & calf. I give to my son James five pounds.
Item I give & bequeath to my son William six pounds above
in equal share to make him equal with the rest:

264. Item I give & bequeath to my son Hugh the plantation on which I now live likewise one plough & tackling, likewise my Negroe boy Jack.

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ann ninety five pounds in money.

I will likewise that all my horn cattle be equally divided amongst my children that is unmarried.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Jean my youngest Negroe girl Hannah likewise six pounds on money.

Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth my Negroe girl Jey & six pounds in place of a saddle.

Item I will further that an obligation lying in my hand upon Col: Martin Armstrong for the making me a deed for a certain quantity of land lying on the western waters, what the rest of my estate both real & personal except a reasonable sustenance for my family for one year, to be sold & equally divided amongst all my children.

Lastly I nominate constitute & appoint my loving wife Jean my son John & John McCrackin executors of this my last will & test: for the execution of the same hereby revoking & disannulling all wills & test, heretofore by me made or intended to be made, confirming this only to be my last will & test: In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal in the presence of the underwritten witnesses, who in my presence & in the presence of each other have witnessed the same this 19th Day of July A.D. 1798.

T. Alexander Donaldson of the County of Rowan & State of N^C Carolina being old but in health of body & of sound mind & memory calling to mind the mortality of body knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do think proper at this time, to make & ordain this my last will & test: Principally I recommend my soul to God who gave it & my body to be buried in in a christian & decent manner at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but I shall have the same again, reunited to my soul by the mighty power of God, through the merits of my redeemer, and as touching the goods of this life wherein it had pleased God to bless me I give, devise & bequeath in the manner following

1. I will & allow all my just & lawfull debts & funeral charges to be paid out of my personal estate.

2. I give & bequeath to my dearly beloved wife Sarah one bed & furniture she to have her choice of what beds are in the house & all my coats, pans, & powder & dresses furniture together with a long wheel, crank reel & spinning wheel & two walnut chairs to be entered upon as her right & property immediately after my decease to her & her heirs & assigns forever.

3. I give, devise & bequeath to my well beloved son William the plantation whereon he now dwells in the County of Ireland & State aforesaid containing four hundred & ninety eight acres be the same more or less together with what he has already received, he paying in to my estate the sum
